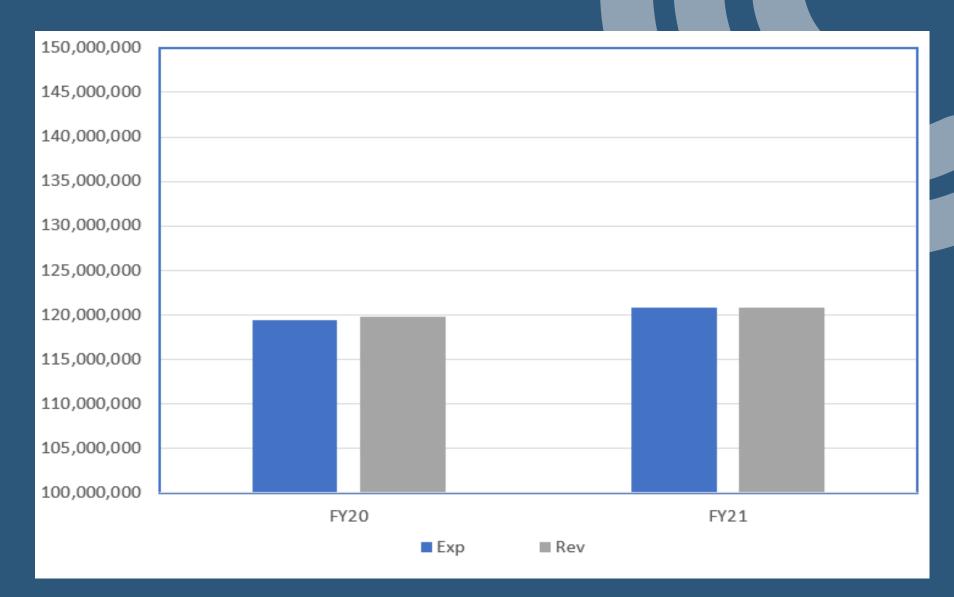

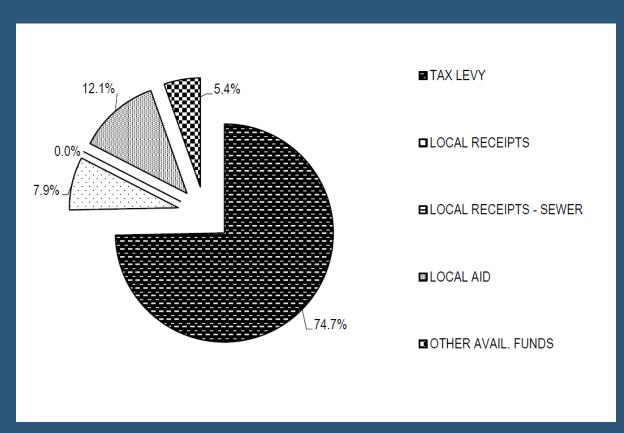

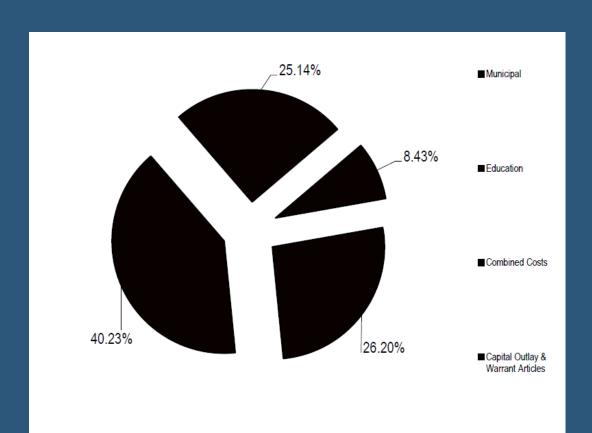

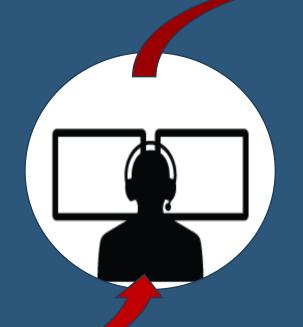

REORGANIZATION

TREASURER/COLLECTOR ASSESSING ACCOUNTING

POLICIES

- Retirement "retire" the liability
- OPEB fund to the level of meal tax or more
- Free Cash "Rainy Day" fund; smaller building renovation or infrastructure improvements - \$300,000 to \$1.5 million; debt retirement
- Capital For building construction/large renovations or infrastructure improvements
- Borrowing in excess of \$1.5 million
