




SAVE THE DATE: ST. PATRICK'S DAY LUNCHEON

THE CIRCUIT BREAKER TAX CREDIT FOR 2023

Certain seniors who own or rent residential property in Massachusetts, as their principal residence, are eligible for a refundable tax credit. As a senior citizen (65 or older by December 31 of the tax year), you may be eligible to claim a refundable credit on your Massachusetts personal income tax return. The Circuit Breaker tax credit is based on the actual real estate taxes or rent paid on the Massachusetts residential property you own or rent and occupy as your principal residence.

The maximum credit amount for tax year 2023 is \$2,590. If the credit you're owed exceeds the amount of the total tax payable for the year, you'll be refunded the additional amount of the credit without interest.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE:

- You must be a Massachusetts resident or part-year resident.
- You must be 65 or older by December 31 of the tax year.
- You must file a <u>Schedule CB</u> with your Massachusetts personal income tax return.
- You must own or rent residential property in Massachusetts and occupy it as your primary residence.
- For tax year 2023, your total Massachusetts income doesn't exceed:

\$69,000 for a single individual who is not the head of a household.

\$86,000 for a head of household.

\$103,000 for married couples filing a joint return.

- If you are a homeowner, your Massachusetts property tax payments, together with half of your water and sewer expense, must exceed 10% of your total Massachusetts income for the tax year.
- If you are a renter, 25% of your annual Massachusetts rent must exceed 10% of your total Massachusetts income for the tax year.
- The assessed valuation of the homeowner's personal residence as of January 1, 2023, before residential exemptions but after abatements, cannot exceed \$1,025,000.

HOW TO APPLY:

Full-year resident taxpayers who have previously filed a Massachusetts return are eligible to file an income tax return and apply for the Senior Circuit Breaker Tax credit on MassTaxConnect for free. If you're eligible, complete Schedule CB with your Massachusetts state income tax return and either submit with MassTaxConnect or by mail.



NEW SENIOR CENTER UPDATE

Here's what has been happening on the project since our January Newsletter:

The Senior Center Building Committee met on January 3 at the Town Hall. Our OPM brought the Committee up to date on the site work. A decision was made regarding the cost and the off-site disposal of the large boulders that were removed during excavation. The OPM reported that the foundation work was completed.

The OPM reported that the underground utilities within the building footprint are expected to be

completed by the end of January. The project remains on schedule.

A sub-committee, consisting of Terri Marciello, Lilia Maselli and Diane Allan, was named to begin evaluating the furniture and equipment that will be incorporated into the project.

The next meeting of the Committee is scheduled for Wednesday, February 7, 2024 at the Town Hall.
