MONTHLY HIKING GROUP UPDATE BY MARK RYAN

Today we walked the trail behind the Harnden Tavern on Woburn St. in Wilmington, MA.. This was on Thursday and the rain date for the usual Tuesday walk. There were four attendees including: Arnie, Katsuko, Chuck and Mark. We walked 1.5 miles in 1:08 hours. You can see trek on the Altrails APP and photos below. Following the APP you can see the trail elevation was mostly 75 ft. above sea level and then changed to 100 ft. as we went up and down hills. It had rained earlier in the week but no damage to the trail. We took the usual straight trail to the dam that followed the old railroad train bed. We then followed a side trail halfway back that went up and down hills. Along the side trail we came across old exercise stations that were built when the Wilmington Health center was built in 1980's. I challenged Arnie to do 40 pull-ups and he counted 10,20,30,40 done. We also came across an old riding lawnmower and some crate slates that must have been arranged as a obstacle course at one time in the past. I saw some plants and trees along the way and identi-

fied them with the APP "Picture This". The plants were: eastern hay-scented fern, red oak, sweet pepper bush, black ash, alder buckthorn, gray birch, maple leaf viburnum, low bush blueberry, white oak, broom fork moss.

SHINE OPEN ENROLLMENT

Open enrollment is October 15-December 7 and the time is now to review your Medicare coverage!

- Each Medicare beneficiary receives an *Annual Notice of Coverage* which is important information regarding Medicare costs and benefits.
- A no-cost visit or phone call with a state-certified SHINE volunteer may reduce your out of pocket medical and/or prescription drug costs, and help you identify public programs that can help with premiums, copayments and health coverage based on income and assets.
- SHINE counselors are available by appointment to help you understand health care coverage, review cost increases, and find out what's new with Medicare.
- SHINE appointments fill up fast during this busy period so schedule now to avoid making last minute decisions or staying in a plan that no longer works for you.

Plan to have the following information available for your SHINE appointment:

- Medicare A/B Card
- Medigap or Medicare Advantage Card
- Prescription Drug Plan Member Card (if you have a Part D Plan)
- List of medications and dosage which can be obtained from your local pharmacy
- My Medicare account username and password (if you have an account created) this will save time as all medications and dosage information are stored and can be updated.

TAX ABATEMENTS

The Town of Wilmington offers Tax Relief programs for Disabled Veterans, Legally Blind homeowners, and Elders who meet certain guidelines.

Widows and widowers who have less than \$50,000 in assets (excluding value of the home) who have lived in the home for at least 5 years are eligible for assistance if the spouse passed before July 1, 2022.

Elders aged 70 and older who have lived in Massachusetts for 10 consecutive years and have owned and occupied the property for any 5 years are eligible for assistance if gross income is less than \$37,802 for a married couple, \$25,201 for a single person including Social Security. The asset limit for this deduction is \$40,000 for a single person, \$50,000 for a married couple.

Please note: If the home is held in a trust, you must be a trustee and have beneficial interest in the property as determined by Town Counsel and a copy of the trust and schedule of beneficiaries must be provided with your application.

UPDATE ON NEW SENIOR CENTER PROJECT

Here's what has been happening since our last Update in the September Newsletter

- The Senior Center Building Committee met on August 31. The main item on the Agenda was the discussion of potential alternates to the building materials and the associated impact on the project cost estimate that was presented at the August 17 meeting. This cost review is referred to as value engineering. The Committee reviewed such things as windows, insulation, masonry, flooring, sidewalks and the patio. The total project cost following the review is \$17.2 million. This includes final design plans and specifications, engineering, inspection, testing, building construction, utilities, furnishings, contingencies and escalation.
- The next meeting of the Senior Center Building Committee is scheduled for October 5.
- The other important meeting in October is the Finance Committee Meeting on Tuesday, October 18 at the Town Hall (7PM) where the financing of our project and the Town Hall/School Administration Building will be discussed. Part of the discussion will be how much of the town's Free Cash will be used for these projects. We encourage you to attend this Finance Committee Meeting to show your support. This is an important step in the process leading up to the Special Town Meeting on Saturday, November 19 at 9 AM.
- This has been a long process to get our new Senior Center. To refresh everyone's memory, here are some key aspects of our project:
 - * The new Senior Center will be located on Main Street opposite Pine Street on town property next to St. Dorothy's Church. The parcel of land has 7.8 acres with 275 feet frontage on Main Street.
 - * It will be a single story 18,800 gross square foot building. The current building is 8,300 gross square feet.
 - There will be approximately 150 parking spaces. Currently we have 42 spaces.
 - * Outdoor amenities include pickleball courts, a bocce court, an outdoor patio and a garden area.
 - * Interior space needs and the building layout were designed to best serve our seniors today and for years to come.

There is less than 2 months until we get to vote on this significant project for seniors. It is so important that everyone circle **Saturday**, **November 19 at 9AM** on their calendar. We need everyone's help. To get the design and construction funds approved, we need to get a minimum of 2/3 of voters in attendance at the Special Town Meeting to vote in favor of this project. Do not take for granted that your friends will be there and you're not needed. You are needed. We have come too far this is "Our Time".

COVID UPDATE

With many tools now available for reducing COVID-19 severity, such as availability of vaccine, boosters, and treatment, there is significantly less risk of severe illness, hospitalization and death compared to earlier in the pandemic. CDC has updated its guidance for people who know they have been exposed to COVID-19.

- If you were exposed to COVID-19, regardless of your vaccination status: CDC recommends that instead of quarantining, you wear a high-quality mask for 10 days and get tested 5 full days after your last exposure (day 6).
- If you have COVID-19: regardless of vaccination status, you should isolate from others for 5 days. If after 5 days you are fever-free for 24 hours without the use of medication and your symptoms are improving, or you never had symptoms, you should test on Day 6. If the test is negative, you may end isolation but should continue masking around others and in public. If the test is positive, you should continue to isolate.

Individuals with moderate illness or severe illness or with a weakened immune system, should isolate through day 10 and consult your doctor before ending isolation.

BOCCE

Stop by the center any time you'd like to use our bocce court, no need to call ahead. When the center is open, bocce balls, scoreboard, and rake are located inside the center in the hallway. You may use the bocce court when the center is closed but you will need to bring your own equipment.
