

#### **SCAMS SEMINAR**

As Chair of the Advanced IT, Internet and Cybersecurity Committee, Senator Finegold has partnered with the Middlesex Sheriff's office to raise awareness about scams, particularly those targeting the elderly. Financial scams targeting the elderly population are not only widespread but on the rise. In fact, according to the FBI, in 2021, there were over 92,000 older victims of fraud, resulting in \$1.7 billion in losses. This is a 74 percent increase in losses from 2020.

#### SKIMMING SCAMS: THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSITIONAL ASSISTANCE (DTA)

The Department of Transitional Assistance (DTA) is warning residents of skimming scams that have impacted some DTA clients. These scams are aimed at obtaining credit, debit, and Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT) card information and Personal Identification Numbers (PINs). DTA is strongly recommending its clients frequently change their PINs.

EOEA is committed to working with DTA to assist in getting the message to potentially impacted clients. If any DTA client believes they may have fallen victim to a skimming or phishing scam, they are encouraged to report it to DTA's fraud hotline at 1-800-372-8399.

Additionally, there have also been reports of a phishing scam where individuals receive scam text messages that their Pandemic EBT (P-EBT) benefits have been blocked. The message directs individuals to call a number where they are asked to provide their P-EBT card number. This message is not from DTA. **DTA only sends text messages from 382-674 and would only direct clients to call the Assistance Line (877-382-2363) or EBT Customer Service Line (800-997-2555).** For additional information, please visit the DTA webpage on Skimming and how to protect benefits.

#### 3 PART ALZHEIMER'S SERIES

Do you have some concerns about yourself or a loved one regarding memory issues? The Department of Elderly Services together with the Alzheimer's Association of NH/MA will be presenting a 3-part series to answer some of these questions. The first part of this series was on Wednesday, August 31, 2022. Information about part II and part III are below.

On Wednesday, September 28, 2022, the Alzheimer's Association will present "Dementia Conversations". This 45-minute program will focus on how to approach someone who is experiencing changes in memory, thinking and behavior and will provide tips and strategies for difficult (but important) conversations about changes that may be related to dementia. This program will be held at 6:30pm at the Wilmington Memorial Library, 175 Middlesex Ave, Wilmington, MA.

On Wednesday, October 26, 2022, the last of the series will be "Understanding and Responding to Dementia Related Behaviors". This program by the Alzheimer's Association will review caregiver tips and strategies to respond to some common behaviors exhibited by individuals living with Alzheimer's and dementia such as agitations, confusion and more. This program will be held at 6:30pm at the Buzzell Senior Center, 15 School Street, Wilmington, MA.

#### MONTHLY HIKING GROUP UPDATE BY MARK RYAN

Tuesday, August 16, 2022: Today's hike was at the Tewksbury Hospital Forest. There were six attendees: Arnie, Rick, Rosemary, Janet, Bob and Mark. The weather was cool but you worked up a sweat from walking. Using the compass App, we headed in Northeast direction. The Alltrails App showed we walked 1.4 miles in 1:03 hours. Most of the walk was out in direct sun around a horse farm. The rest meandered through woodland trails. We paired off in twos and enjoyed casual conversation. I talked mostly with Bob and related a story of my childhood in Chelsea, MA in the 1950s when the Tobin Bridge cut the city in half. I lived at the end of Chestnut St. near the Naval Hospital. After the bridge was finished there were huge piles of sand left over in vacant lots. We called the area the mountains. After a while tall grass and weeds grew all over the sand and soil underneath. As kids we would make forts in the grass with left over wood from the houses taken down for the bridge. The tall grass supported wildlife and we found snakes, frogs, birds, rabbits and other creatures. It was like our own Forest in the city. The reason for telling that story was the tall grasses we were now walking through in the Tewksbury Forest. It brought back memories. As we walked the trailhead from Lot E at the hospital we soon came to a horse farm with fields of tall grass. There were large and small corrals holding horses. Some large horses and small ponies. One black horse was kept separate and had splotches of white salve all over his body. Poor animal must have got bitten by insects or flies. There were lots of plants and weeds to identify. Rick pointed out some thistle and Rosemary remembered the fairy tale about thistles that I soon forgot. Some of the plants you can see in the photos I identified as deer berry, hazelnut, huckleberry, low bush blueberry, wild carrot, milkweed, chicory, bull thistle, purple loosestrife, and honeysuckle. Along the woodland path we came across a play area for Elementary kids. There was a height board that measured your height in horse hands. I was 17 hh tall and Janet was 16 hh tall. There was another area that had plastic colored flowers



and a plaque that asked how many flowers of each color. Well that's it for this week.

#### TAX ABATEMENTS

The Town of Wilmington offers Tax Relief programs for Veterans, Legally Blind homeowners, and Elders who meet certain guidelines.

Widows and widowers who have less than \$50,000 in assets (excluding value of the home) who have lived in the home for at least 5 years are eligible for assistance if the spouse passed before July 1, 2022.

Elders aged 70 and older who have lived in Massachusetts for 10 consecutive years and have owned and occupied the property for any 5 years are eligible for assistance if gross income is less than \$37,367 for a married couple, \$24,911 for a single person including Social Security. The asset limit for this deduction is \$40,000 for a single person, \$50,000 for a married couple.

Please note: If the home is held in a trust, you must be a trustee and have beneficial interest in the property as determined by Town Counsel and a copy of the trust and schedule of beneficiaries must be provided with your application.

#### UPDATE ON NEW SENIOR CENTER PROJECT

Here's what has been happening since our last Update in the August Newsletter:

- The first of two important meetings that took place in August was the Board of Selectmen Meeting on August 8. The meeting was held in the auditorium of the Town Hall. In attendance were members of the Senior Center Building Committee, members of the Town Hall/School Administration Building Committee, the Finance Committee and the School Committee. George Hooper, Chair of both Building Committees, along with the architect for each of the projects, gave a presentation to bring the Board of Selectmen up to date on the status of both projects. The Town Manager began a discussion regarding the financing for both projects. More discussion is needed between the Town Manager, Board of Selectmen and Finance Committee to determine the appropriate amount of Free Cash to be used.
- Also, on the Agenda for the Board of Selectmen meeting was the setting of the date and time for the Special Town Meeting. It was voted that the Special Town Meeting will be held at 9:00AM Saturday, November 19, 2022 in the High School Auditorium. There are only two articles on the Warrant for that Meeting; one for the Senior Center and one for the Town Hall/School Administration Building.
- Prior to the Special Town Meeting, there will be a Public Forum on both projects; date is to be determined. In addition, the Finance Committee will have a Public Hearing, tentatively scheduled for October 18, to review both projects and the proposed funding.
- The second important meeting was the August 17 Senior Center Building Committee meeting. At that meeting, the architect and our Owner's Project Manager (OPM) presented the preliminary construction cost estimate prepared by an independent consultant. The detailed item by item cost estimate consisted of 21 pages. Final design, construction administration and inspection and testing and other services, as well as contingencies for design, construction and escalation were then added to arrive at a total project cost. The total preliminary project cost estimate is \$17.1 Million. The Committee is going to review the cost estimate and discuss it further at its August 31st meeting.

We have come a long way in getting a new Senior Center but we still have some important steps to take to bring it to fruition. Mark your calendars for the **Special Town Meeting**; **Saturday**, **November 19**, **at 9:00AM**. We will also keep you informed relative to the date of the Public Forum and Finance Committee Meeting. These are also important steps in getting this project approved.

#### COVID UPDATE

With many tools now available for reducing COVID-19 severity, such as availability of vaccine, boosters, and treatment, there is significantly less risk of severe illness, hospitalization and death compared to earlier in the pandemic. CDC has updated its guidance for people who know they have been exposed to COVID-19.

- If you were exposed to COVID-19, regardless of your vaccination status: CDC recommends that instead of quarantining, you wear a high-quality mask for 10 days and get tested 5 full days after your last exposure (day 6).
- If you have COVID-19: regardless of vaccination status, you should isolate from others for 5 days. If after 5 days you are fever-free for 24 hours without the use of medication and your symptoms are improving, or you never had symptoms, you should test on Day 6. If the test is negative, you may end isolation but should continue masking around others and in public. If the test is positive, you should continue to isolate.

Individuals with moderate illness or severe illness or with a weakened immune system, should isolate through day 10 and consult your doctor before ending isolation.

#### BOCCE

Stop by the center any time you'd like to use our bocce court, no need to call ahead. When the center is open, bocce balls, scoreboard, and rake are located inside the center in the hallway. You may use the bocce court when the center is closed but you will need to bring your own equipment.
