## BOARD OF REGISTRARS OF VOTERS MEETING AGENDA

The Board of Registrars of Voters meeting will convene via ZOOM call on Thursday, June 4, 2020 at 10:30 a.m.

Pursuant to Governor Baker's March 12, 2020 Order Suspending Certain Provisions of the Open Meeting Law, G.L. c. 30A, §18, and the Governor's March 15, 2020 Order imposing strict limitations on the number of people that may gather in one place, members of the public who wish to listen to the meeting may do so in the following manner: via Zoom audio. This meeting of the Wilmington Board of Registrars of Voters is being conducted via remote participation. No in-person attendance of members of the public will be permitted, but every effort will be made to ensure that the public can adequately access the proceedings in real time, via technological means. Members of the public who would like to listen to this meeting while in progress may also do so via may do so in the following manner: by telephone by dialing 1-646-558-8656 and enter meeting ID 830 3057 2241 then press # and press # again at the next voice prompt. There will be no public participation allowed.

- 3. Approve minutes from April 11, 2019 meeting
- 4. Discussion COVID-19 safety procedures to be instituted during the June 20, 2020 Annual Town Election:
  - a. Clerk for every Precinct but one warden per polling location
  - b. Seeking election workforce members not in high risk categories; safety protocols for worker to include masks, plexi-glass shields between workers and voters,
  - c. Shortening shifts for workers; no meals served
  - d. Training will be via video emailed out to members or Zoom call

- e. Limit number of voters allowed in polling locations based upon the square footage of each location
- f. Encourage voting by mail for all voters, including election workers. Emergency election law passed by the state legislature expands allowable reasons for absentee voting and provides for Early Voting by mail
- 5. Potential changes to Fall Elections due to COVID-19 Emergency
- 6. Question and answers of members
- 7. Adjourn
