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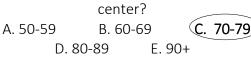
Our van driver, Sonja Halliday dressed up in her dinosaur costume and handed out treat bags to everyone who came.

KEEP YOUR IDENTITY AND MONEY SAFE ... DON'T FALL VICTIM TO SCAMS!

The most effective way to defeat scammers is to know how to identify scams. You should just hang up on any call you're uncertain of and ignore any suspicious emails. Many scammers pose as federal agents or other law enforcement using fear tactics to get what they want.

In each upcoming newsletter we are going to go into detail about one of the 6 most common scams; Grandparent Scam, Sweepstakes scam, Home Improvement Scam, Telemarketer Scam, Internet Scams, and Charity Scams. Last month we learned about the Home Improvement Scam. This month, we are going to learn about the Telemarketer Scam.



<u>Telemarketer Scam</u>: Scammers will target seniors in an effort to obtain financial information by claiming to be from an important institution such as a credit card company, Microsoft, Social Security Administration, Internal Revenue Service, phone company, power company, and so on. Never feel pressured to commit to anything over the phone.

• Don't rely upon caller ID to let you know who the call is coming from. Technology today allows for calls to be masked and appear to be from a number you know or can associate with, <u>but it is not</u>.

- Never give out personal information to an unsolicited caller. Never provide birthday, social security number (even the last 4 digits), your mother's maiden name, pet's name, bank account information or anything that can be used as password or identifying information.
- Hang up and contact the company the caller claims to be with directly if you feel you need to talk to them. Refer to your copy of your phone bill, power bill, or the number on the back of your credit card or bank card to initiate contact.

MEDICARE PHONE CALL SCAM



Beware of this Medicare phone call scam as there have been reports of this call from Wilmington residents. The caller ID shows that the call is coming from the Town of Wilmington. When answered, it is an automated message stating that their Medicare benefits are going to expire. Hang up this call immediately and do not give out any personal information! If someone calls you and asks for your Medicare Number or other personal information, hang up and call 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227).

UNEMPLOYMENT SCAM

Another scam has come to our attention. This one involves fraudulent unemployment claims - due to the high level of unemployment claims filed, scammers have been able to submit false claims. If you receive a letter from the Department of Unemployment Assistance with a Bank of America debit card in your name, but you have <u>not</u> filed for unemployment benefits - this is an indicator that your information has been compromised. You should immediately contact the Massachusetts Department of Unemployment Assistance at 877-626-6800.

ALMOND PINECONES:

Rosemary Eaton

- 1 1/4 Cups whole raw almonds 1 8oz package cream cheese (NOT low or non fat)
 - (crumbled) 1/2 TSP Dill Weed
- 1/2 Cup mayonnaise
- 1/8 TSP black pepper

1 TBSP chopped onion

5 Strips of crispy cooked bacon

- Spread almonds in a single layer in a shallow pan. Bake 300° for 15 minutes until almonds begin to brown.
- Combine softened cream cheese and mayonnaise, mix well.
- Combine rest of ingredients and add to cheese mix. Chill overnight.
- Form mixture into two ovals on a serving platter. Beginning at the narrow (bottom) end. Press almonds at a slight angle ("head" into the cheese) Overlap rows until cheese mix is covered.
- For holiday flare, cut sprigs of pine, spruce, or yews to insert into top ends on cone.
- Serve with crackers.

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CRUMB TOPPING:

- 1 Cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 Cup packed golden brown sugar

FILLING

1 Teaspoon cinnamon

1/8 Teaspoon salt

- PIE CRUST: Pillsburv
 - Use Pillsbury Pie Crust

- While filling is in the oven, prepare the crumb topping
- Whisk flour, sugar, cinnamon, and salt in small bowl
- Add butter and rub with fingertips until mixture begins to clump together

1/2 Cup chilled unsalted butter

- Sprinkle topping evenly over hot pie. Continue to bake until apples are tender and topping is browned and crisp, tenting pie with foil if browning too quickly. About 50 minutes. Cool pie on rack at least 2 hours.
 - Cut pie into wedges and serve warm or at room temperature with whipped cream or ice cream.
