Tune in to Celebrating the Season: Songs & Stories airing Thursday, November 12, 2020 at 7PM on WCTV (Comcast 9/Verizon 37 or online at wctv.org/live). Award winning singer and storyteller Davis Bates shares songs and stories celebrating the harvest, Halloween Power of culture and Thanksgiving. It includes sing-alongs, a trick-or-treating tale, a ghost story, family

lore, spoon playing and an appearance by a dancing wooden dog named Bingo.

Pete Seeger called Davis "thoughtful, creative, human, and a fantastic storyteller." Davis' traditional and participatory performance style empowers and encourages audiences of all ages to join in the fun, and to take the songs and stories home with them to share with others. He also encourages listeners to remember and tell stories from their own family and cultural traditions.

Davis Bates has been telling stories for over forty years, in schools, libraries, colleges and community settings around New England and across the country. His recording of Family Stories won a Parent's Choice Gold Award and was named one of the year's best Audio Recordings by Booklist Magazine. Davis has also served as director and consultant for several local and regional oral history and folk arts projects. Davis lives in the village of Shelburne Falls, MA, and when he isn't collecting or learning stories, he spends his time working with the Hampshire College Alumni Advisory Group and gardening on the Hampshire campus and at home. The performance is sponsored by the Wilmington Council on Aging. You do not want to miss this program! 3 COMMON WAYS PEOPLE GET PHISHED

The term Phishing is used when someone pretends to be someone they aren't in order to obtain your personal information and, ultimately, your money. So it's important to realize that banks will never approach you via text, email, or phone to ask you for your account number, PIN, or other data.

If you didn't expect a call from the bank, it could be a scam. Don't provide any information!

Hang up and call your bank.



Your bank will never ask you to sign in, or give personal information via text message.

Delete the message and call your bank.

Watch out for any email that asks you to click a link or provide personal information.

Delete the email and call your bank.



KEEP YOUR IDENTITY AND MONEY SAFE ... DON'T FALL VICTIM TO SCAMS!

The most effective way to defeat scammers is to know how to identify scams. You should just hang up on any call you're uncertain of and ignore any suspicious emails. Many scammers pose as federal agents or other law enforcement using fear tactics to get what they want.

In each upcoming newsletter we are going to go into detail about one of the 6 most common scams; Grandparent Scam, Sweepstakes scam, Home Improvement Scam, Telemarketer Scam, Internet Scams, and Charity Scams. Last month we learned about the Sweepstakes Scam. This month, we are going to learn about the Home Improvement Scam.



<u>Home Improvement Scam</u>: Scammers target seniors by providing home improvement services in order to gain access to their home, belongings, and personal information. They will arrive at their target's house, offer free inspections, or offer services to fix something they deem "needs work." The scammer may pretend to be working for the local town or county to appear more legitimate.

The homeowner should stay in control of the situation and not be intimidated by the person at the door:

- Never let them in your home
- Be suspicious of unsolicited offers, and ask for identification.
- If work does need to be done, ask friends and neighbors who they would recommend. Be sure to get references, and only use licensed contractors.
- Never pay the full amount up front. Pay as the work is completed according to a contract.
