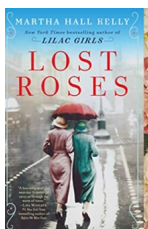

SHINE OPEN ENROLLMENT

October is Medicare Open Enrollment time beginning October 15 and ending December 7. Limited appointments are available with local SHINE counselors in-person, by telephone or over ZOOM. To arrange a SHINE appointment please contact the Senior Center at 978-657-7595.

Save time and plan to bring with you your Medicare A/B card, current insurance and/or Part D card, MassHealth ID, and prescription drug list with dosage. This free program is available in all languages through a three-way call using a professional medical interpreting service.

For those with computer access visit: www.medicare.gov to create a My Medicare account, be sure to securely store your username and password. If you are not yet receiving Medicare, you may access the Medicare Planfinder from using your zip code, prescriptions, and preferred pharmacies. The Medicare Planfinder will produce a report that includes premiums, annual out of pocket costs like co-payments and annual deductibles, and other important details.

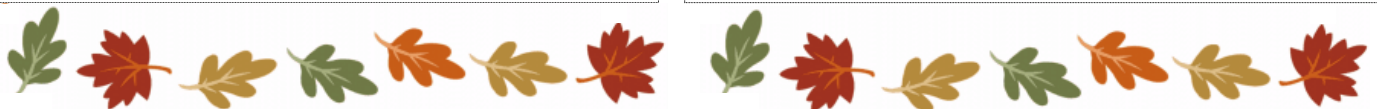

UPDATE ON NEW SENIOR CENTER PROJECT

On Wednesday, September 15, a joint meeting of the Senior Center Building Committee and the Town Hall/School Administration Building Committee was held at the Town Hall and televised live. You can watch a tape of the meeting on WCTV. The committees include members of the Permanent Building Committee, the Board of Selectmen, the Finance Committee, the School Department and Terri Marciello, Director of Elderly Services. The town's Owner's Project Manager (OPM) and representatives from Dietz and Company (architects for the Senior Center) and Johnson & Roberts (architects for the Town Hall/School Administration Building) met with the committees to review and evaluate the 4 identified building sites.

A matrix was developed by the two architects that included objective and subjective criteria. The 6 objective criteria included such things as wetlands and availability of utilities. The 11 subjective criteria included adequate buildable area and relative site development cost, among others. Following a discussion, the matrix was unanimously approved. Each architect then rated, via a numerical scale, the 4 sites against the approved criteria for their individual project.

The scores were then tabulated and analyzed. Following a discussion, the ranking was finalized. The number 1 ranked site for the Senior Center was the property adjacent to St. Dorothy's Church. The number 1 ranked site for the Town Hall/School Administration Building was the former Swain School site near the Town Common. The complete ranking of all sites is as follows:

Senior Center:

- Site adjacent to St. Dorothy's church
 - Swain School site
 - Present Town Hall site

Town Hall/ School Administration:

- Swain School Site
- Site adjacent to St. Dorothy's church
 - Present Town Hall site

*The Whitefield School site was deemed unsuitable for either project.

Several seniors were in the audience and offered comments supporting the number 1 ranked site at St. Dorothy's Church for the Senior Center.

A motion was made and voted unanimously to recommend to the Town Manager, who was in attendance, the Joint Committee's site recommendation for each of the proposed buildings. It was expected that the Town Manager will present the recommendations to the Board of Selectmen at their meeting on September 27. A report of the results of that meeting was not available in time for inclusion in this newsletter.
