HOW TO PLAY: All you need is a pen and paper! I will ask the question and players will write down their answer. There are two ways to sign up...

- 1. Simply call the center to sign up. Tell us the date you'd like to join and give us your email address. We will email you the link to the zoom event. On the day of the event, click on the link and you will be entered into the video chat.
- 2. Sign up online for any of these events at www.myactivecenter.com This is a secure and easy to use site to browse and sign up for events at our senior center and others in the area. Create an account using your My Senior Center card (the card you scan when you enter the center). If you do not have a card, call the center and we will assign you one. Next, choose Buzzell Senior Center as the closest center available. The site will remember that this is the preferred location. In the search bar, search "Zoom Trivia" and click on it. Click on the date you'd like to join and click register. A new screen will pop up, click register again. The event will then be added on your My Activity Center calendar. The Zoom Meeting link will be emailed to you a couple days before the event. A few minutes before it begins go to your email and click on the link, then you will be entered into the video chat.

KEEP YOUR IDENTITY AND MONEY SAFE... DON'T FALL VICTIM TO SCAMS!

The most effective way to defeat scammers is to know how to identify scams. You should just hang up on any call you're uncertain of and ignore any suspicious emails. Many scammers pose as federal agents or other law enforcement using fear tactics to get what they want. In each upcoming newsletter we are going to go into detail about one of the 6 most common scams; Grandparent Scam, Sweepstakes scam, Home Improvement Scam, Telemarketer Scam, Internet Scams, and Charity Scams. Since Grandparents day is this month, lets start off with the Grandparent Scam...

One of the most common scams presented to seniors is the **Grandparent Scam**. The caller claims to be a relative, a grandson, or granddaughter, and the call is urgent. Typically, the grandchild is out of town and is in trouble, needs money fast for some emergency, and doesn't want the rest of the family to know. The caller may have bits of information, some of which could be collected from sources like social media, and prompts the senior to provide more information, making the call seem genuine.

This is <u>NOT</u> a legitimate call. Hang up the phone and contact your family or the authorities.



- Threaten you with benefit suspension, arrest, or other legal action unless you pay a fee.
- Promise a benefit increase or other assistance in exchange for payment.
- Require payment by gift card, cash, wire transfer, internet currency, or a prepaid gift card.
- Demand secrecy from you in handling a Social Security-related problem
 If you do not have ongoing business with Social Security, it is unlikely they will call you. JUST HANG UP!

(This is to make sure we are compliant with the 8 persons restriction per group).

All activities will be as scheduled (weather permitting)




