Sergeant Samuel Michael Demers, USMC, age 25, passed away unexpectedly on the 20th of June 2022 in

the city of Twentynine Palms, CA. Sgt. Demers was born and raised in New Bedford, MA, and spent his adult life with his wife and daughter stationed on aboard Camp Lejeune, NC and the Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center 29 Palms, CA.

Sam grew up playing baseball at SEYAA and loved spending time with friends and family. He graduated high school from Greater New Bedford Regional Vocational Technical High School in 2015, where he was an active part of the track team.
